The pandemic led to many closings and cancellations, but your local United Way continued to fight for the Health, Education and Financial Stability of Cass County residents. Many people, due to the economic effects of the pandemic, had to ask for help for the first time. United Way brought in a \$225,000 COVID-19 Grant, partnered with the City of Logansport to bring in an additional \$100,000 for COVID-19 relief and \$13,000 in local funding. We partnered with several nonprofits in Cass County to coordinate funds and additional programs to

assist in fulfilling the new and existing needs of our community. While the campaign looked a lot different than we had originally imagined, we were still able to raise \$532,790. \$100,000 was matched and will be used for community impact work over the next two years. We appreciate every volunteer and donor who helped to contribute to a successful 2020. The work we do could not be done without selfless community members who helped make it happen.



It was not all that long ago that I was feeling the energy of kicking off a new campaign and generating a buzz amongst our donor base. Unfortunately, a certain virus had a different plan and cast a dark cloud over not only the campaign, but also our way of life.

Early concerns focused on how we would get access to our donor base considering nearly every employer in town was operating with their doors closed. As the campaign progressed, we were happy to have been given access to some of the local businesses, most of which was prompted by business leaders realizing the importance of the campaign and the United Way

to the operations of the community. Thankfully, many of our early CEO calls reinforced the fact that business leaders were still optimistic that we would meet our goals despite societal conditions. So, we trudged onward.

While I would like to take some credit for the money that has been raised, I would suggest you look no further than the two women sitting in the office who are grinding on a daily basis. I can say with some confidence that this has been one of the most unconventional campaign years on record, but the United Way staff have kept the course so that Cass County residents can reap the rewards. Thanks to the United Way staff, all the division chairs and their volunteers. Covid has battered and beaten many, but the United Way and the community programs it supports have won the fight.

While COVID-19 did add obstacles to this annual event, Cass County still came together to volunteer. A little over 200 volunteers from various organizations donated their time and skills to help complete 30 projects throughout the county.

UW Impact



FamilyWize, a prescription drug card, allows those with a card to receive discounts on prescriptions at participating pharmacies. These cards helped 158 Cass County residents, saving a total of \$10,877. 42% of those who benefited from FamilyWize cards were 65 or older.



Our VITA (Volunteer Income Tax Assistance) Program completed 250 total tax returns for Cass County residents in 2020. 135 volunteer hours were dedicated to the success of this program.



2-1-1 recevied 1,237 calls from Cass County residents in 2020. The top five needs were: Food Pantries, Electric Service Payment Assistance, Rent Payment Assistance, Adult Protective Services, and Housing Search and Information.

Covid Response

In a partnership with the Lilly Foundation and Indiana United Ways, we received \$225,000 in grant funding. We were able to provide nonprofits in our community with additional funding to assist with the needs of the pandemic. The following organizations received funding through this grant: The Salvation Army, YMCA, The State Theater, Family Services of Howard County, Felix's Pantry, Neal Home, and Food Finders. We also partnered with the City of Logansport to get a \$100,000 grant for COVID relief. Through this partnership, we worked with Felix's Pantry and many volunteers to provide meals made by local restaurants for those in need in June & July. This also enabled the Logansport Backpack Program to continue providing weekly supplemental food through June and July. Area Five, United Way, Logansport Schools, and several volunteers collaborated to ensure the food bags were delivered each week. The Emergency Food and Shelter Program was coordinated through the United Way office and \$31,023 was allotted to The Salvation Army and Emmaus Mission Center with this funding.
