2024: LOOKING BACK

While we came up short of our campaign goal, raising just over \$400,000, United Way of Cass County still experienced a lot of success, generosity, and impact in 2024.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, we were able to secure an \$85,992 matching grant that will support internal capacity building, along with three targeted initiatives: Youth Support Groups through Project Hope, CPR and First Aid Training for local childcare providers, and the Pathway of Hope program through The Salvation Army.

Our staff is dedicated to serving our community, not just through our own work, but through other local organizations as well. In 2024, our staff served on various boards and committees and supported other organizations through events like Downtown Green & Clean, the Kiwanis Flag Program, Walton Library's Mental Health Outreach Event, and many others.

One of the highlights of 2024 was our 17th Annual LIVE UNITED® Day, which brought together over 700 volunteers to work on 46 projects across the county. It's a powerful reminder of what can happen when we all LIVE UNITED®.

We are especially grateful to our Campaign Co-Chairs, Lynne Ness and Kelly Stephenson of Security Federal, for their leadership and dedication throughout the campaign. We had a lot of fun working with them and can't thank them enough for their efforts. To our donors, volunteers, and partners, your support continues to move our mission forward and build a stronger Cass County. We're proud to carry on a legacy of impact that began in 1937 and look forward to continuing to serve Cass County for many years to come.

PARTNER PROGRAM SPOTLIGHT

Salvation Army 360 Life Center

A woman accessed services at the Center from a referral from another social services agency. She was homeless and was new to the area after moving in with a family member that was not safe. Case management was provided along with access to other Salvation Army services including emergency shelter. She was able to stabilize in emergency shelter and work towards moving in the area. She found employment in Logansport and moved in with a friend that she felt was very safe and would work with her housing needs.

Volunteer of the Year



Our volunteers are at the heart of everything we do, working with us to make an impact in our community. Our 2024 Volunteer of the Year was Chef Mike Huffer from Woodbridge. WoodBridge has donated meals for many of our events in the past, including the Rally and Live United Day in 2024.

Chef Mike volunteers his time to coordinate everything necessary and to prepare the food. On Live United Day this past year, Chef and his team made over 340 lunches for our volunteers! Chef has been a part of United Way for many years, and we appreciate all he does!

CASS COUNTY READING RAILROAD

When children receive the supports and resources needed to build skills throughout their formative years, we're all better off in the long-run. Cass County Reading Railroad seeks to provide our community's children with books and programs that do just that. **Over 3,000 children are served annually** through four key programs: Begindergarten™, Business Partners, Dolly Parton's Imagination Library, and First Grade Library Visits.









Begindergarten™ is one of Reading Railroad's signature programs, created many years ago to address the growing need to ensure children were entering kindergarten ready to learn. Children are assessed at kindergarten registration and invited if their assessment score is under the threshold. This program provides FREE kindergarten readiness preparation to participants, providing instruction in the key skills needed to start their academic career.

Begindergarten™ students also further their social skills, understand the school environment, learn cafeteria expectations, and build other skills students need to be successful in a school setting. Some children do not have preschool experience, so Begindergarten™ helps them develop these skills. Thanks to our supporters and our partnership with Logansport Community School Corporation, we were able to serve 100 children through this program in 2024.

Dolly Parton's Imagination Library provides an age-appropriate book to Cass County children each month from birth to age five. In 2024, **17,831 books were mailed** to Cass County children. This program ensures that children have access to quality reading materials at no cost to families.

The Imagination Library covers administrative costs of the program. Reading Railroad and United Way of Cass County serve as the local affiliate and cover the cost of books and postage. The State of Indiana began covering half of the bill for local affiliates starting in September of 2023. Children must be signed up for this program.



LIVE UNITED® DAY

It's amazing to see how much LIVE UNITED Day has grown in recent years, and the growth is a testament to how our community comes together to help others. The 17th Annual LIVE UNITED® Day brought **over 100 more** volunteers than the previous year. Each year on this day, we get to witness so many selfless people serving our community. Thank you to everyone who contributes to making this day a success, especially our committee!
